1.6 Contractor requirements

- Contractor shall provide a means to keep dust and dirt during construction contained and out of the existing facility.
- Contractor shall work weekday evenings 60% of the job and normal business hours 40% of the job.
- Contractor to have a clean work area and discard all waste during the day and at completion of every day.
- Contractor shall keep heat loss at a minimum from temporary openings to the outside.
- All openings shall be secured at the end of each workday.
- Contractor to provide the Initial Estimated Firm Fixed Price for each separate project and shall be itemized.
- All dimensions for equipment shall be verified by the contractor, information provided by Albany is for information only and Albany shall not be held responsible for dimensional errors.

1.7 On Site-Safety & Security Requirements

- Any personnel who will be working on site must meet the following.
- Must provide current proof of US Citizenship or Permanent Lawful Residence as follows by one of the following.
 - o US Passport.
 - Original US Birth Certificate and/or government issued photo ID, (Driver's License).
 - A company letter head signed by a company official or HR Manager listing each person & stating that each person has been verified that the individuals are legal to work in the US of A.
 - o Current Permanent Lawful Resident card (green card).
 - Must attend Albany Engineered Composites Contractor Safety and Security Training. This is a 35 minute video.
 - Must provide their safety program and go through a Pre-Construction Safety meeting.
- At a minimum the safety program must meet OSHA requirements and all individuals must comply with those requirements at all times.
- No pictures are to be taken; the Albany project manager can provide photographs of specific objects to the contractor.
